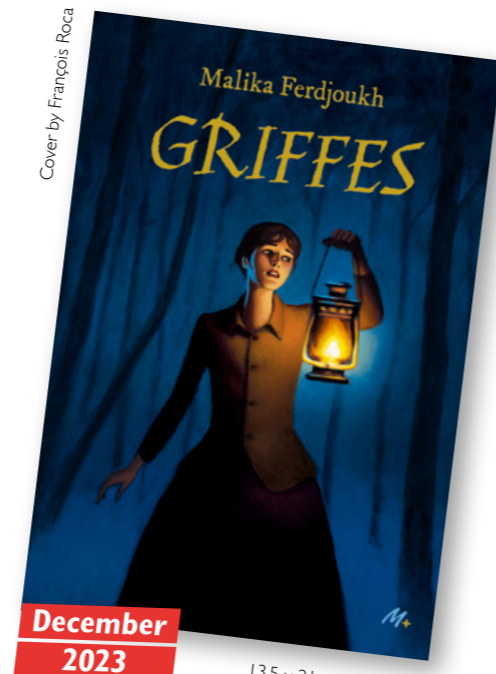
ÉCORCE VIVE

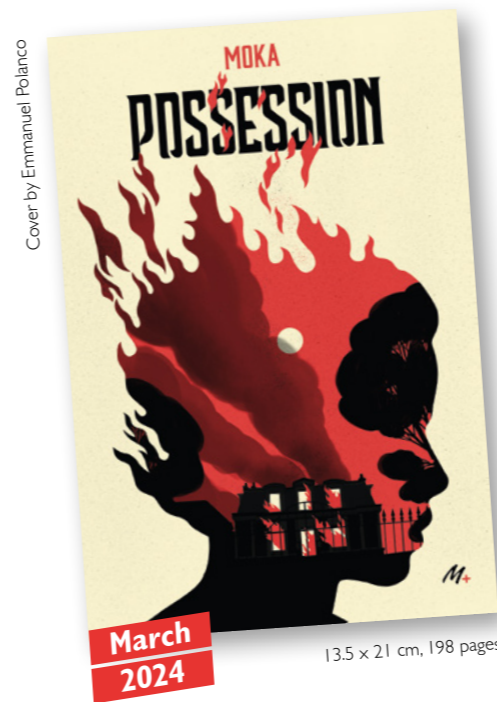

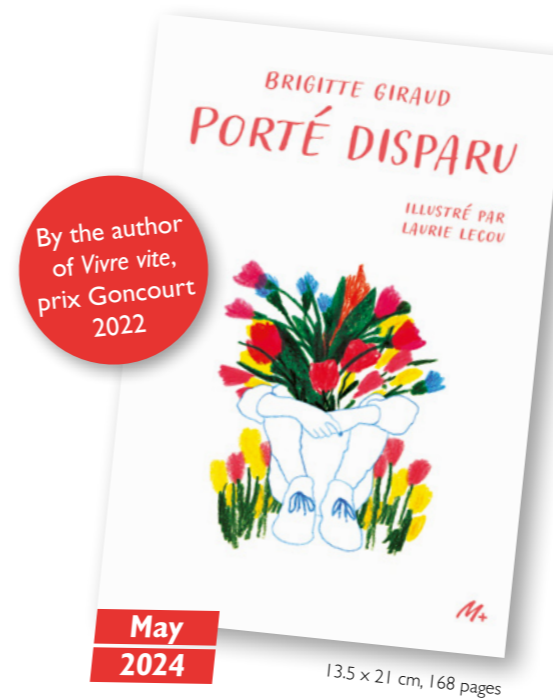
